

LETTER OF INTENT

Between

**Identity Management Sub-Committee (IMSC) of the
Public Sector Chief Information Officer Council and the
Public Sector Service Delivery Council**

And

The Digital Identity and Authentication Council of Canada (DIACC)

April 13, 2016

Background:

1. The Public Sector Chief Information Officer Council (PSCIOC) and the Public Sector Service Delivery Council (PSSDC) are governmental advisory/consultative bodies without corporate status that are comprised of senior officials of the federal, provincial and territorial governments of Canada and an association comprising of municipal governments.
2. IMSC is a sub-committee of the PSCIOC and PSSDC and can, through IMSC co-chairs, represent its members in relation to matters within its mandate.
3. DIACC is a not-for-profit corporation and a neutral forum comprised of public and private sector members with an objective of developing a Canadian digital identification and authentication framework.
4. IMSC and DIACC acknowledge that:
 - a. A trusted digital identity is important to strengthening the future economic potential and social benefit of Canada
 - b. Achieving an agreed upon approach to trusted digital identity is possible when all sectors work collaboratively
 - c. There are likely going to be constitutional, legislative and regulatory requirements to be considered within respective jurisdictions when providing identity-related digital services
 - d. There will likely be non-regulated private sector innovating identity-related digital services that will require understanding of the constitutional, legislative, and regulatory requirements.

Participant Intentions:

5. IMSC and DIACC confirm their intention to work together, in a spirit of co-operation for as long as it remains mutually convenient and without legal obligation, to develop one Pan Canadian Trust Framework considering public and private sector contexts

6. IMSC and DIACC acknowledge that it is their intention, in a spirit of co-operation for as long as it remains mutually convenient and without legal obligation, to collaborate on the development, modification, and/or the application of interoperable technical and data standards in addition to related proofs of concept or pilot projects as required.

7. The IMSC and DIACC acknowledge that there is no relationship of principal and agent, employer and employee, partnership or joint venture between them and that they do not wish to create any.


